We have 37% of the children reaching the end of year Reading expectation now, 23% reaching the end of year Writing expectation and 42% at the end of year Mathematics expectation. This is extremely pleasing as we are not yet half way through the year. Keep up the good work.

We have a few 'bugs' around at the moment.


- ❖ A very nasty cough/flu type illness. Keep your child home if they have symptoms of this. It spreads easily.

- <u>Uniform</u> we want our children to be proud of their school and wear the appropriate uniform to show us apart from other schools. So, please remember –
 - Children are required to wear our correct uniform. Royal blue polo shirt, royal blue polar fleece jersey and <u>black only</u> shorts, longs, skirts, skorts etc. Girls may wear black tights. Our sunhat is compulsory in Terms 1 and 4.
 - Shirts, jerseys and sunhats are available at the school office shirts \$30, jerseys \$40, hats \$10. We don't sell the 'bottom half' of the uniform as you should be able to buy something reasonably priced in town... (as long as it's black *\emptyset*).
 - Every child would have been given a black Warriors jacket when they started school – they need to wear this in the winter or on cold or wet days.
 - Uniforms should be clean.


