You will then be taken to a page which you will need to do the following

Step 1: Enter your email address, your name and your student's name(s).

- Your email address is used to send you confirmation of your bookings.
- Select the number of students you want to make bookings for, and fill in their names.
- Press the green "Go" button to go on to the next page.

Step 2: Choose a teacher. (a dropdown menu will appear)

- Press the green "Go" button to go on to the next page.

Step 3: Choose the time(s) you want.

- Leave time to get from one booking to the next - *back-to-back bookings are not a good idea.*
- Missing checkboxes mean that time has already been booked by someone else.
- Press the green "Go" button to confirm your bookings.
- **Please note that school will finish at 12.30pm on Tuesday 2nd July. Please make arrangements for your children to be looked after on that day.**

Medical Reminders



We have a few 'bugs' around at the moment.

- ❖ A very nasty cough/flu type illness. Keep your child home if they have symptoms of this. It spreads easily.
- ❖ If your child has had vomiting or 'number twos', they MUST stay home for 2 days after the last symptom.
- ❖ Headlice are always around so make sure you check your child's hair regularly and treat if necessary. We have treatments at school if this helps (free).
- ❖ If your child is at all unwell, please keep them home so that they don't pass bugs on to other children. Also if a child is feeling unwell they are not able to learn easily and are much better off at home snuggled up in bed.

Enrolment Scheme

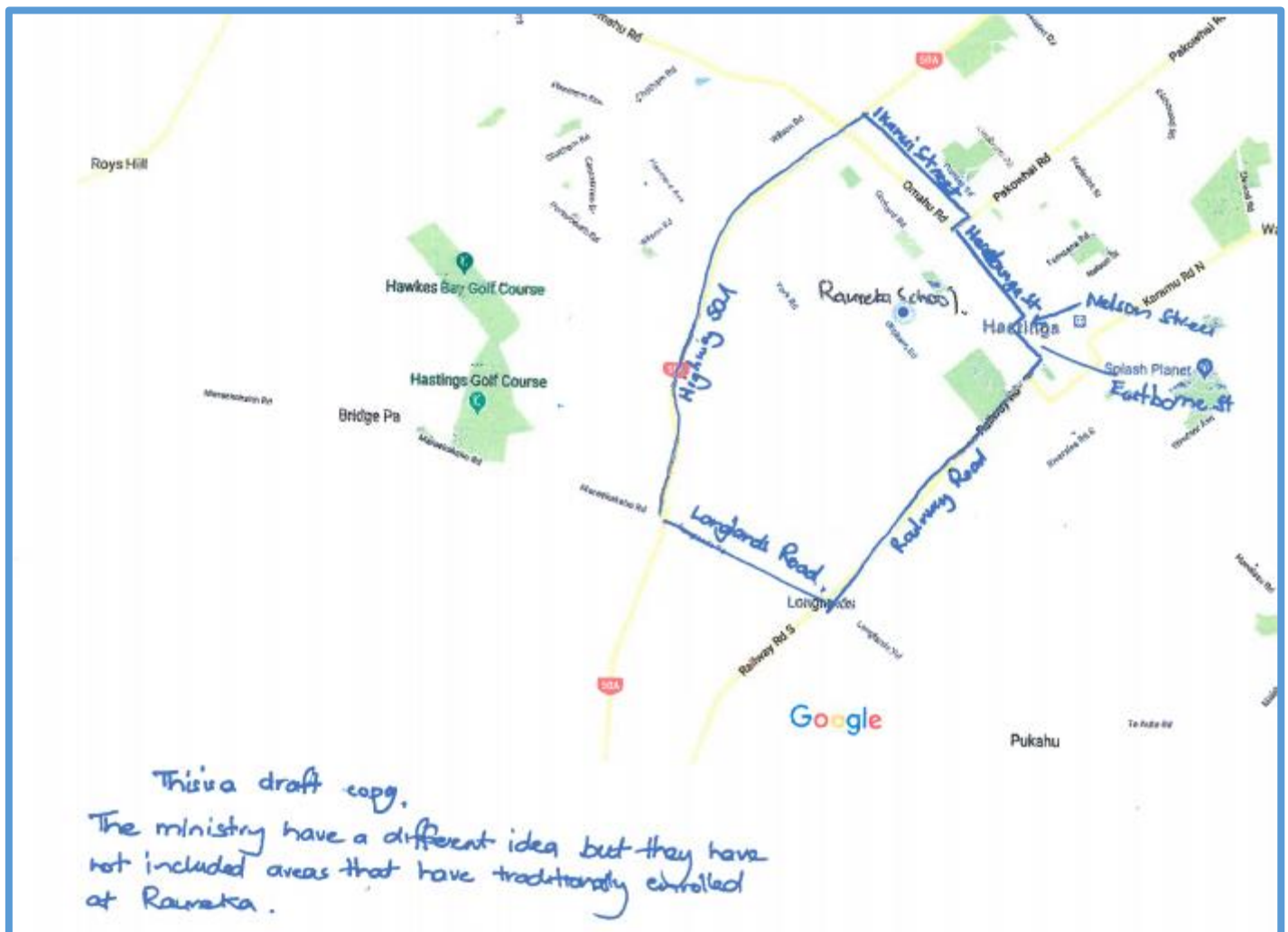
The Ministry of Education has advised the Raureka School Board of Trustees that we are to implement an Enrolment Scheme and a 'Home Zone' to avoid overcrowding. The enrolment scheme does not affect any students currently enrolled at Raureka School.

Once the scheme is in place it will mean any whanau living outside the 'home zone' intending on enrolling their child will have to do so before a given date, and the balloting priorities will apply:

- ☐ Sibling of current students
- ☐ Sibling of former students
- ☐ Children of former students
- ☐ Children of board employees or board members
- ☐ All other participants

A tentative map of our zone is attached. This has to be approved by the Ministry of Education. This does cross over some other schools, although we have included areas traditionally where children have enrolled at Raureka.

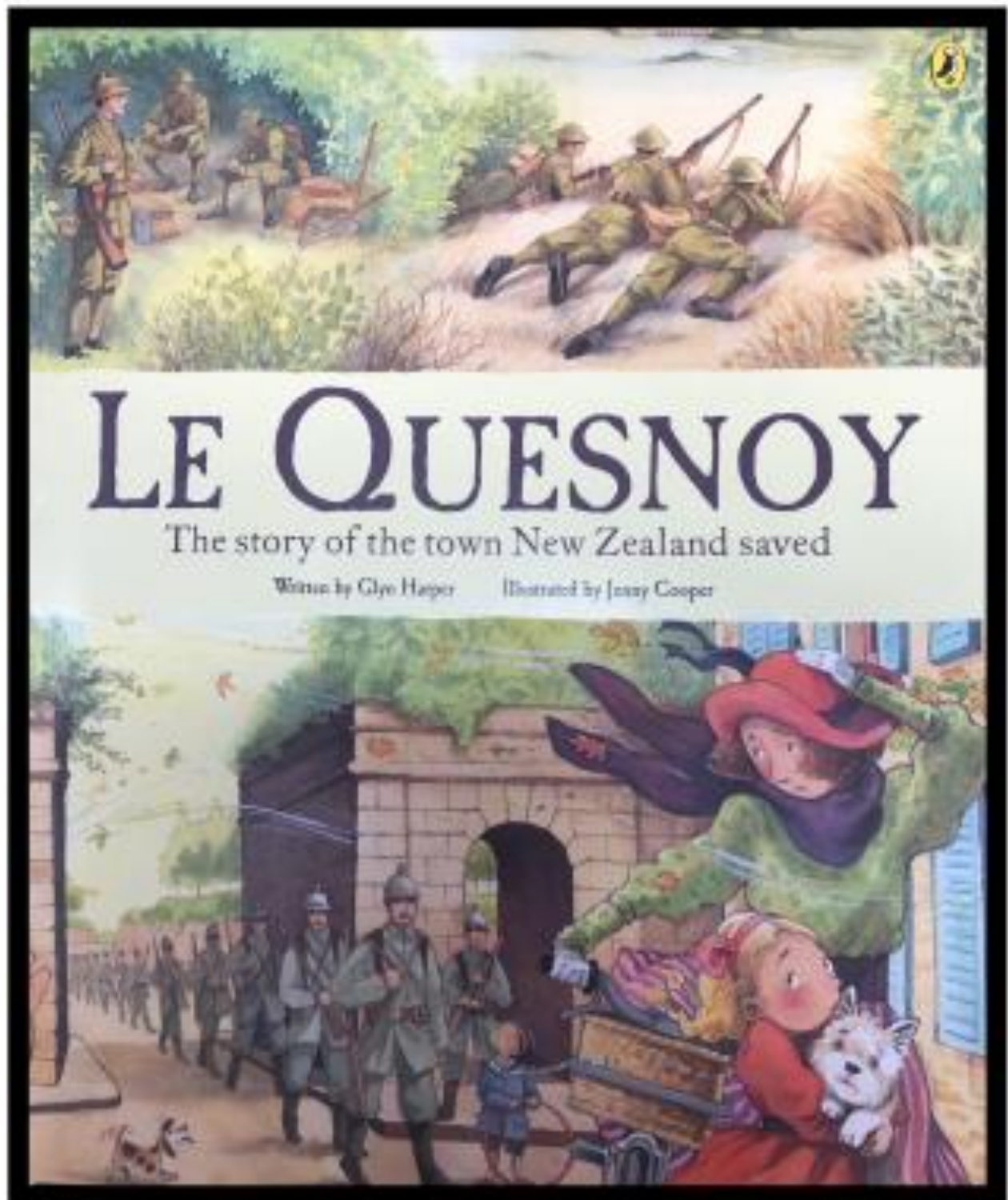

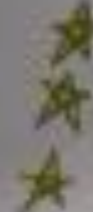

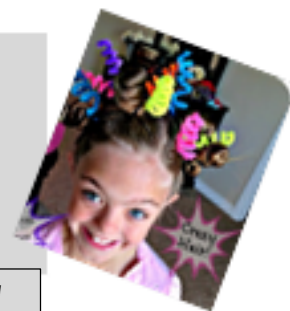
