Medical Updates



Measles is still about – if in doubt, check it out.
This is very serious. Contact your medical practice immediately.

If your child is at all unwell, please keep them home so that they don't pass bugs on to other children. Also if a child is feeling unwell they are not able to learn easily and are much better off at home snuggled up in bed.



A common problem, just about always around schools are headlice (makutu) – check your child's hair weekly. If they have live lice they must stay home and be treated. Children may not be at school with live lice. We have free treatments at school. Note that a lot of treatments will 'stun' the lice so you can comb them out.

They don't necessarily kill them. You need to repeat combing and treating as eggs will continue to hatch.

If your child has had vomiting or diarrhoea, they MUST stay home for 2 days after the last event. This illness definitely spreads quickly around the school.

Don't forget to contact the school office to let us know when your child is unwell please. A brief description of the illness helps us track what is about too.

Try using the steps below to make some yummy snacks this week.

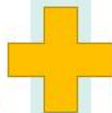
1. Start with a whole grain or wholemeal base:
