## Medical Updates



Measles is still about - if in doubt, check it out.  
This is very serious. Contact your medical practice immediately.

If your child is at all unwell, please keep them home so that they don't pass bugs on to other children. Also if a child is feeling unwell they are not able to learn easily and are much better off at home snuggled up in bed.



A common problem, just about always around schools are headlice (makutu) - check your child's hair weekly. If they have live lice they must stay home and be treated. Children may not be at school with live lice. We have free treatments at school. Note that a lot of treatments will 'stun' the lice so you can comb them out. They don't necessarily kill them. You need to repeat combing and treating as eggs will continue to hatch.

If your child has had vomiting or diarrhoea, they MUST stay home for 2 days after the last event. This illness definitely spreads quickly around the school.

Don't forget to contact the school office to let us know when your child is unwell please. A brief description of the illness helps us track what is about too.

#### Measles

Measles has now arrived in Hawke's Bay after spreading around NZ in recent months. Measles is a highly contagious disease and more than one in four people who catch it will be admitted to hospital. The best protection against measles is immunisation – MMR (Measles, Mumps and Rubella) ideally given at 15 months and 4 years of age. If you have children that are not immunized, please encourage families to go to their GP as immunizations can still be given. **ECE's / Primaries / Intermediates, Please ensure that your school's Immunisation Register is fully up to date.** You can contact your PHN for advice.

#### Working with your PHN

Your Public Health Nurse (PHN) is the regular "face" of health and wellbeing in your school. You can work with your PHN to tackle concerns of personal health, but also to raise issues relating to promoting health and wellbeing throughout the school community. Your PHN may work through a School Hauora Reflection conversation with you to highlight any particular strengths and weaknesses. Your PHN can easily introduce you to a Health Promoting Schools Facilitator. If you have children in your school community with particular severe medical needs, please have a specific conversation with your PHN as soon as possible.

#### The importance of sleep

Lots of children struggle to concentrate during the day at school because they don't get enough regular sleep. Regular bedtime habits make a real difference here – a consistent time for bed, a consistent time to get up, a predictable routine of winding down, cleaning teeth and quiet reading.



#### Keeping Safe in the Summer Sun

##### Slip, Slop, Slap, and Wrap



It's Term 4 and it's important to remember to protect your students and your staff from the harsh Hawke's Bay sunshine.

- Stay in the shade from 10 - 4
- Wide brimmed hats protect the face, neck and ears
- Close fitting, wrap around sunglasses protect your eyes from UV radiation
- Half a teaspoon of sunscreen to face, ears and neck
- One teaspoon of sunscreen to each arm and leg
