Here we are into Week 7.

Once again, thank you very much to everyone who supported our Y6 Carnival. An amazing **\$4,859.70** was taken on the day. There are still a number of costs to be taken out but this was a marvellous effort and a great start to the Y6 fundraising for camp. There will be more fundraising events to come as we look to raise around \$10,000 to cover camp costs.

Place Based Education: We are looking at updating our current curriculum to ensure that we use our local area and know about its history. We would then use this knowledge in our Termly plans.
